

The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

June 19, 2022

The First Reading tells how Melchizedek, king of Salem (early name for Jerusalem), comes to greet Abraham. Melchizedek is also a priest. As such he brings an offering of bread and wine to Abraham, and pronounces a blessing over him. In Christian tradition that bread and wine were taken to prefigure the bread and wine of the Eucharist.

Psalm: You are a priest forever, according to the order of Melchizedek.

Paul's account of the institution of the Eucharist is the earliest written account of the origin of the Eucharist. When we celebrate the Eucharist not merely is Christ present, but we re-enact the death by which he saved us. The Eucharist not only looks to the past, but also looks forward to the fulfillment of the Kingdom.

The eucharistic significance of the multiplication of the loaves is brought out by the use of liturgical language.

Luke uses the same words here as at the Last Supper and Emmaus: Jesus "took...blessed...broke...gave..." In the Eucharist the Church continues the mission of Jesus to teach, to heal, and to nourish the people of God.
