MARRIAGE AND ANNULMENT

-A marriage is a covenant by which a man and a woman establish between themselves a partnership which of its very nature is ordered to the well being of the spouses and to the procreation and upbringing of children.

The essential properties of marriage are unity and indissolubility.

A marriage is brought into being by the manifested consent of persons who are legally capable.

How do I know if an annulment is possible for me?

-Start by contacting your parish priest or the Archdiocesan Marriage Tribunal (416-934-3423)

Do I need a divorce before beginning annulment procedures ?

-Yes. The annulment is never given until a final decree of divorce has been declared.

A formal decision process by the Marriage Tribunal involves an adjudication of grounds for invalidity of a union previously presumed to be valid. The union may involve Catholics as well as non-Catholics.

I am a catholic. The person I want to marry is a divorced, non-Catholic Christian. Must he/she have his/her annulment in order to be married in the Catholic Church?

-Yes, the Catholic Church recognizes the marriage of two baptized Christians as valid. Therefore such marriages, even though they did not take place in the Roman Catholic Church, must also be presented for annulment before a marriage to a Catholic party can take place.

If, for a serious reason, a Catholic wishes to marry a non-Catholic in the other person's church, special permission must be sought and received from the Archdiocese. In any case, only one religious ceremony is permitted.

Annulments issued by the Orthodox Church are not automatically binding; a review and ratification of the Orthodox annulment must be done by a Catholic tribunal.

Baptism Godparents

We remind everyone once again that baptism godparents must be practicing Catholics and confirmed.




Income Tax Receipts
