Stations of the Cross

During the time of the crusades (1095-1270), it became popular for pilgrims to the Holy Land to walk in the footsteps of Jesus to Calvary. In the next two centuries, after the Moslems recaptured the Holy Land, pilgrimages were too dangerous. A substitute pilgrimage, the Stations of the Cross, became a popular outdoor devotion throughout Europe during the Middle Ages. They represented critical events from Scripture or tradition of Jesus' journey to Calvary and varied in number from 5 to 20 until the 18th century when Pope Clement XII fixed the number to 14. In the mid 18th century, the Stations of the Cross were allowed inside churches. That's when the Stations became a familiar feature in all Catholic churches. After the Second Vatican Council, in the 1960s, it became popular to add a fifteenth Station representing the Resurrection of Jesus.

Sacred Triduum

Originally, there was no Holy Week. The Pascha (Páscoa) or Easter was celebrated in the context of a single day. It began with the sunset on the Sabbath evening and continued until dawn of Sunday, the first day of the week.

By the 5th century, the Paschal Mystery was extended to three days starting on Holy Thursday evening. With Constantine and the end of persecution of Christians, Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday, were all enforced as holy days. It was also a tradition that those in prison be pardoned. For the first three centuries the Easter Vigil was the only feast observed by all Christian communities. Easter is the oldest feast of the Church.

Every Friday during Lent we will have the Via Sacra (Stations of the Cross) at 6:30 p.m.


ShareLife
