Exorcisms

The Judeo-Christian tradition and many other religions accept that humans can be possessed by demonic spirits. Catholics acknowledge that the devil exists and that he may have power over some people. The Bible recounts at least six instances of Jesus casting out demons.

But, please, don't believe everything you see in the movies. What makes good Hollywood is often far from the truth. There are countless exorcism-inspired films and what is claimed to be based on a true story is often widely exaggerated or even completely made up.

A lot of exorcisms were and are done based on ignorance. Almost all the physical healings done by television-evangelists or charismatic figures are false and often performed on people who are emotionally troubled and then the consequences can be terrible.

In 2003, an autistic eight year old boy in Milwaukee was killed during an exorcism by church members who blamed an invading spirit for his disability. In 2005, a young nun in Romania died at the hands of a priest during an exorcism after being bound to a cross and left to die. And on Christmas Day in 2010, in London, England, a fourteen year old boy was beaten and drowned to death by relatives trying to exorcise an evil spirit from him.

An exorcism can be performed only by a trained priest and only with the permission of his bishop. Pope Francis has advised priests who hear troubled confessions from parishioners to not hesitate to call on the services of an exorcist, chosen with great care and prudence.

In an exorcism, the demonic entity is commanded to leave the person, not by the authority of the priest, but "In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit".

Before an exorcism is performed, the Church always investigates to be sure mental illness isn't involved, since treating this illness is the concern of medical science.

First Reading (Zech 9:9-10) The messianic king is portrayed, not as a proud warrior, but as a humble and gentle champion of peace for all peoples.

Responsorial Psalm: I will bless your name for ever, my King and my God.

Second Reading (Rom 8:9.11-13) St. Paul contrasts life 'in the spirit' with life 'in the flesh'.

Gospel (Mt 11:25-30) Jesus reveals the Father to those who are 'little', and lightens the burdens of those who are humble.

The prophet Zechariah foretells the coming of the messianic king who will put an end to war to establish peace. It was as such a Messiah that Jesus entered Jerusalem before his passion. Matthew sees Jesus as fulfilling this prophecy. Jesus lightens the burdens of the poor and brings peace to the humble.
