Can a Catholic be Cremated?

For many centuries the Church insisted that Catholics follow only the manner of Christ's burial by either entombing or burying the body. However, since 1963, the Church declared that cremation can be an alternative to burial.



Cremation does not deny the Christian doctrine of the souls immortality nor the resurrection of the body.

As Catholics we see the body as a temple of the Holy Spirit and the Church prefers that cremation be carried out only after the actual body was present at the funeral Mass.

Since 1997, the Congregation for Divine Worship approved cremation as an acceptable practice for Catholics and allows for the cremated remains to be present at a funeral Mass, provided that they are reverently buried or afterwards entombed in a mausoleum or columbarium.

This means we should not keep the ashes on display at home on the mantle or put away in a bank vault. This precludes the scattering of remains in public parks, on mountain tops, along highways or divided amongst friends and family members.

There is a spiritual and emotional benefit when the cremated remains are laid to rest in a proper place for burial. It gives the bereaved a place to focus remembrance and to pray for the deceased.

First Reading: (Exodus 22:20-26) God tells the Israelites that there must be no discrimination against or exploitation of the weak members of their society.

<u>Responsorial Psalm</u>: I love you, O Lord, my strength.

Second Reading: (1 Thessalonians 1:5-10) Paul encourages the Thessalonians by telling them that their exemplary lives have become known far and wide.

Gospel (Matthew 22:34-40) Today's Gospel reminds us of the two great commandments: love of God and love of neighbour.

By rabbinical count, 'the Law' consisted of some 613 commandments.

The question as to which commandment was the greatest was one frequently discussed among the rabbis.

Jesus was asked to name one, but responded by naming two. That is because, for him, the second followed directly and necessarily from the first. Love of neighbour arose out of love of God. Both

commandments are found in the Old Testament. What is known is not the fact that Jesus brought these two commandments together, but that he made them of equal importance.
