

Baptism

Baptism is a "birth" into the Christian community and, in this way, it is as solemn and important as birth itself. We need to have faith and we need to practice our faith, to really understand and appreciate it. It is not something else to "get done". We don't baptize because it is a tradition.



For pastoral reasons a priest may delay a baptism but if he follows the Church guidelines he should never deny it. And if he is "one of those", please don't take it too personal...just ask another priest. At St. Mary's we can always talk about it and find a way to help.



My baby was baptized at birth because of illness. Can he be re-baptized again? No. Baptism can not be repeated. We can not become what we already are. However it is desirable that you have a celebration in the church, with godparents, and share in the prayers and blessings which are part of the baptismal ceremony.

Who can be a godparent?

For obvious reasons only practicing Roman Catholics can be godparents. Although one of the godparents who is a member of another Christian community may stand as a Christian witness.

An unbeliever or a person that says to be Catholic but does not practice, cannot be a godparent. We cannot take the "god" out of "godparent". Before baptism parents and godparents have to declare their faith. It's all part of the package. One should never stand in front of a church full of people and make promises that one has no intention of keeping.

In the Early Church, baptism was mostly for adults, but with the rapid growth of Christianity around the third and fourth centuries, the practice of baptizing infants became very common. However times have changed. We live now in a secular age and the need for adult baptism is back (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults). Adults wanting to join the Church do it at the Easter Vigil. After being properly instructed, they are baptized, confirmed and make their first Communion. For them there is no need for godparents, only a sponsor, and again practicing is part of the package.

First Communion and Confirmation Meetings

On Wednesday, January 24th, we will have a meeting for parents of the children that will be receiving their First Communion.

On Wednesday, January 31st, we will have a meeting for parents or sponsors to the young adults that will be receiving their Confirmation.

All parents or sponsors should attend these meetings.

II Sunday in Ordinary Time January 14, 2024

First Reading (1 Sam 3:3-10.19) The prophet Samuel played a very important role in the history of Israel. Here we have the story of his call by God.

Psalm—Here I am, Lord; I come to do your will.

Second Reading (1 Cor 6:13-15.17-20) Paul tells us that our bodies are temples of the Holy Spirit, and we must use them, not for sin, but for the glory of God.

Gospel (John 1:35-42) In the Gospel we will hear Jesus say to his first two disciples, 'Come and see'. They accepted his invitation and had an encounter with him which changed their lives. Each time we celebrate the Eucharist we have an opportunity to encounter the Lord.

The main theme of the readings, however, is that of call and response. In the First Reading we have the call of Samuel, who played a big part in the building up of Israel. His call marked the beginning of a new era. It was through him that Israel got its first kings. This paves the way for the Gospel story of the call of the first disciples—Andrew, John and Peter. The call of Peter is highlighted because of the important role he played in the first community.

In the two readings we are dealing with a unique and specific call, what is more commonly called a vocation.

Gather Your People
