THE CHURCH

What does "Church" mean? It means an assembly of people, a believing community. The New Testament calls the Church the Body of Christ because it is made up of people trying to carry on the work and teaching of Jesus. "Church" comes from the Greek word "ekklesia".

In the Nicene Creed the Church is described as one, holy, catholic and apostolic.

Catholic means universal or worldwide.

Apostolic means it is based on the teachings of the apostles.

Today, Christians are divided into many denominations, but when Christianity first began there was only one Church.

In the beginning local communities were led by elders, sometimes called overseers. These people were later known as *presbyters* (priests) and *episkopos* (bishops). In the large cities there were seniors bishops.

Today there are 2.19 billion Christians in the world, half of them being Roman Catholic.

The bishop of Rome, right from the beginning, was given special respect, and was called *Papa*, from Latin meaning father. Pope Francis is the 266th pope of the Catholic Church.

Outside of Rome there were also some important bishops in the ancient cities of Alexandria, Jerusalem, Constantinople and Antioch.

After a while, however, various groups started separating from the main Church.

A major split came in the eleventh century when the Western and the Eastern sections of the Church separated from each other. The Eastern churches became known as the Orthodox Churches.

Five hundred years later there was also a major split in the Western Church (Roman Catholic) when the Protestant Churches, protesting against the corruptions of the medieval Church, no longer accepted the Pope as their leader. This is known as the Reformation.

Protestant churches also divided spawning many offshoots such as the Baptist Church, the Methodist Church, etc.

Santo Cristo Festival


Next Weekend we will have the Santo Cristo Festival. This festival was first celebrated in our Church in 1966. All are welcome.

First Reading (Acts 9:26-31) This tells us about some of the trials Paul endured after his conversion. This First Reading tells how, three years after his conversion, Paul to Jerusalem. In spite of being introduced by Barnabas, such was the hostility he encountered that he had to be smuggled out of the city. The fact that Paul took all these trial in his stride shows the depth of his faith in Jesus.

Psalm: Lord, from you comes my praise in the great congregation.

Second Reading (1Jn 3:18-24) The Second Reading tells us what we have to do in order to be at rights with God. We have to believe in his Son, Jesus, and live one another as he told us. Active charity is what distinguishes true Christians form those who are such in name only.

Gospel (Jn 15:1-8) In the Gospel we have the lovely image of the vine and the branches. Here Jesus stresses the unity that exists between him and his disciples. Vine and branches need each other. The vine cannot bear fruit without the branches. And the branches can have no life if separated from the vine. The branches need to be pruned (by trials) in order to be fruitful.
