SAINT ANTHONY

Saint Anthony, one of the most popular saints to the church, was born and raised in a wealthy family in Lisbon, on August 15, 1195. At the age of 35 he died on the 13 of June, 1231 in Padua, Italy. His baptismal name was Fernando Martins de Bulhões. Educated in Lisbon and Coimbra, he became a Franciscan friar with the name of Anthony. While in Coimbra the bodies of five Franciscans whom he had met and later had been beheaded in Morocco were brought to Coimbra to be buried as martyrs in the Abbey of Santa Cruz.

At once Anthony decided to become a martyr himself. But no sooner had he arrived in Morocco then he became so ill that he was forced to turn around, set sail back to Portugal in hope of regaining his health. However, the return ship was blown off course and landed instead in Sicily.

In Italy Anthony was assigned to a small hospice for lay brothers at Monte Paolo. It was a lowly assignment, befitting a brother who, up to this time, had shown no remarkable talents. Eventually word quickly spread about Anthony's gifts, profound learning and talent as a preacher, that Anthony was sent on a preaching mission all over Italy. Thousands flocked to his open-air sermons and men were reported to give up gambling and drinking after listening to him. Criminals were reformed and feuding enemies were reconciled.

Anthony's visits created a spiritual revival. He attacked the tyranny of the powerful and was unsparing when it came to the failings of the clergy. So successful were his exhortations to charity that wherever he preached that he earned many titles: "Friend of the Poor", "il Santo" "Mio Dolce Santo". "Meu Santo António", etc.

Weary from his exhausting mission, Anthony died young, in Padua, on June 13, 1231, before turning 36. He is a beloved saint well known all over the Christian world.



Today's readings are about faith and hope, virtues that are much needed in a world where people suffer the "demons" of poverty, racial inequality, fear of strangers, or fear of anyone who is different from what is accepted as "normal." When our safety and security is threatened, we try to hold on desperately to what we have and what we know.

Jesus stepped outside those boundaries and turned to the indulgent love of God to free the suffering.
