#### Blessed Frédéric Ozanam (1815-1853)

A man convinced of the inestimable worth of each human being, Frédéric served the poor of Paris well and drew others inter serving the poor of the world. Through the Saint Vincent de Paul Society, his work continues to the present day.

Frédéric was the fifth of Jean and Marie Ozanam's fourteen children, one of only three to reach adulthood. As a teenager he began having doubts about his religion.

Although his father, a doctor, wanted him to become a lawyer, Frédéric wanted to study literature. Yielding to his father's wishes, he began studying law at the University of the Sorbonne in 1831. When some professors mocked Catholic teaching in their lectures, Frédéric defended the church. A discussion club he organized sparked the turning point in Frédéric's life. In this club, Catholics, atheists and agnostics debated the issues of the day.

After Frédéric once spoke eloquently about Christianity's role in civilization, a club member responded: "Let us be frank, Mr. Ozanam; let us also be very particular. What do you do besides talk to prove the faith you claim is in you?"

Stung by that question, Frédéric soon decided to ground his words in action. He and a friend began visiting Paris tenements and offering assistance as best they could. Soon the Saint Vincent de Paul Society was born.

After Frédéric earned his law degree, he taught law at the University of Lyons. He also earned a doctorate in literature. In 1841, he married Amelie Soulacroix and returned to the Sorbonne to teach literature. A well-respected lecturer, Frédéric worked to bring out the best in each student. Meanwhile, the Saint Vincent de Paul Society grew through Europe. Paris alone counted twenty-five conferences.

The Conference of Saint Vincent de Paul at St. Mary's is one of the oldest in the city of Toronto and is still active. Thank you for your continuous support.

# **Psalm:** *O Lord, who may abide in your tent?*

Today, as we resume the reading of Mark's Gospel, we meet a controversy over ritual All three readings tie in with one cleanness. another. In the First Reading Moses urges the people to be faithful to God's Law, without adding to it or subtracting from it. It is not a burden to be endured, but a source of life and wisdom. The Gospel shows what happened in practice. To the Law of God (given through Moses) they added their own traditions, which came to be regarded as equally authoritative and binding. Worse, they got in the way of God's Law. Mark is making clear to Gentile Christians that being followers of Christ does not involve them in the observance of Jewish practices. The Second Reading (the first five from the letter of St. James) shows the essential link between faith and love. Nothing could be more practical than this. Nowhere is the way to sanctify so clearly indicated. Lord, help us to worship you with a sincere, humble and loving heart.
