The Meaning of Marriage

Roman Catholics, Orthodox, Lutherans and Anglicans, call marriage a sacrament. All Christians think that a special blessing is given in marriage and that the couple is spiritually joined together. This idea comes from the story of Genesis (2:23-4): "man leaves his father and mother and is united with his wife, and they become one". And Jesus said "Man must not separate, then, what God has joined together" (Mark 10:9).

The Old Testament (The Hebrew Bible) called marriage a "seal upon the heart" as does the Orthodox custom of crowning: "Let their love for each other be a seal upon their hearts and a crown upon their heads".

Marriage is first and foremost a relationship. And sexual activity is part of that deep relationship. Not every couple has children but most couples do and feel fulfilled in having them.



Here he depicts the greed of the wealthy, who can't wait for the holy days to be over so that they can get back to making money by dishonest practices. He condemns the separation of worship from the proper treatment of other people, especially the poor.

Psalm: Praise the Lord who lifts up the needy.

The Bible doesn't always give us examples to be imitated. At times it gives us examples to be learned from painfully. The servant in Jesus' story is one of these, brought forward to teach Christians the wise use of money. Here Jesus stresses the impossibility of any compromise between God and Mammon. For Luke, to use money wisely is to give it to the poor, and thus ensure one's eternal salvation.
